

In 1900, Elgar was asked to write a piece for the Birmingham Triennial Music Festival. And because he was the sort of person who enjoyed a challenge, he decided to write a piece about life, death and what comes afterwards. And, boy, did he pull it off!
So what's it about?

Oh just life, death and the meaning of life...

The massive piece for chorus and orchestra is based on a Victorian poem by Cardinal John Henry Newman. Elgar really went to town on the orchestration of *Dream of Gerontius* – he was one of the most famous composers of the time, after all. So when he asked for a full-size orchestra, three choirs and soloists, he got them. With an organ thrown in.
